CURIOSITY GRANTS

Look inside to find out how to get money for your learning project.

The Vicksburg Community Schools Foundation (VCSF) is pleased to offer a "Curiosity Grant" opportunity for students in the Vicksburg Schools. Grants will generally be in amounts varying from \$50.00 to \$250.00; however, it is possible that projects may be considered for larger amount as funding allows.

GRANTS MUST BE FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES AND WE ENCOURAGE CREATIVITY.

Guidelines for Students in Grades 6-12
Individual Students

1. Individual students must submit an application form. You may get assistance from an adult but the idea and plan need to be yours.
 2. Grant requests to attend camps will not be considered.
 3. You may apply each year; however, you may receive a lower priority consideration than first-time requests.
 4. If you do not complete the project, the monies will be returned to the Foundation.
 5. Money granted for field trips may not be used to cover transportation costs or food.
 6. After you have completed the project, you must inform the Foundation of your results. A written summary (with photographs or video if possible) would be helpful.
- Groups of Students or Classes, Student Organizations, etc.
1. Curiosity Grants are only considered if the application comes from individual students. Groups planning on a group activity (trips, speakers, etc) must select one or more individuals as the group contacts or spokespersons to write and submit the request.
 2. While teachers or other adults may inspire your curiosity, they may not submit or fill out applications.
 3. If you do not complete the project, the monies will be returned to the Foundation.
 4. After you have completed the project, you must inform the Foundation of your results. A written summary (with photographs or video if possible) would be helpful.
 5. Curiosity grants may be applied for student field trips on the following conditions:
 - The money is to be used for paying for the activity itself.
 - The trip or activity is not primarily recreational in nature.
 - Highest priority will be given to those trips that fulfill a unique curiosity, not normally addressed in the curriculum, as well as groups that have not had grants for trips before.

Guidelines for Students in Grades Pre-K – 5
For Individuals and Groups of Students

1. A teacher or other adult may submit an application on behalf of an individual student or a group of students.
2. If a group of students is applying, one or more contact students need to be named, along with the name of their classroom teacher.
3. Grant requests to attend camps will not be considered.
4. As part of the application, the adult will need to show how they will inform the Foundation on the results of the activity, specifically:
 - What activities took place.
 - The learning objective and how it was met.
 - A brief written summary (with photographs or video if possible) would be helpful.
5. Curiosity grants may be applied for student field trips on the following conditions:
 - The money is to be used for paying for the activity itself.
 - The trip or activity is not primarily recreational in nature.
 - Repeat trip requests may get lower priority as well as those that benefit the same group of students over a number of years (for instance a request for a trip for the first grade class at Elementary X in one year and then a request for the second grade class for Elementary X the next year).
 - Highest priority will be given to those trips that fulfill a unique curiosity, not normally addressed in the curriculum, as well as groups that have not had grants for trips before.
6. If you do not complete the project, the monies will be returned to the Foundation.
